

A Blessed Trip To Remember

ALOHA!!!

On July 23, 2010, eight Floridians, led by President Barbara Wright, were blessed by God to take a journey of a lifetime. Neither of us had attended the Baptist World Congress or Baptist World Alliance (BWA) Women's Conference, nor had we visited Hawaii. The ten (10) hour trip via Houston was one of great anticipation.

We arrived on a bright sunny day and because of the **awesomeness of our God** cannot begin to describe the magnificent wonders of His creation, i.e., the mountains, ocean, flowers, blue skies, etc., we saw. Post cards pale in comparison. Although all of this was exciting and breath-taking, the conferences were even more so.

The Sheraton Waikiki was the site of the Women's Conference and our luxurious home for our visit. The theme was "In Step With The **Spirit"** (Galatians 5:25) and was prayerfully planned including participants from the seven (7) Continental Unions of Africa, Asia, Caribbean, Europe, Latin America, North America and South West Pacific. This diversity was evident throughout the conference beginning with the ALOHA DINNER where each wore their native costumes. (We dressed in our Unity Jackets). If that wasn't enough, we sang "How Great Thou Art" each in her own language. What a glimpse of what the **BODY OF CHRIST** is, diverse but unified in HIM.

The Women's Conference, July 24th thru 27th, focused on **Poverty**, **Abuse and Human Trafficking**. Each Continental Union, including North America, shared what was happening as it relates to these the concerns and the efforts that the **Holy Spirit** led them to establish to address them. We in North America are often deluded into thinking that these are the concerns of other countries, but we were informed that these concerns should be ours also.

Amazingly, although we were over twenty-five hundred (2,500) women representing over one hundred (100) countries and many languages and dialects, the name **JESUS**, a smile and a hug were universal. The warmth of God's love was felt among His women as we worshipped, studied, praised, fellowshipped, prayed and ate together. **TO GOD BE THE GLORY!**

The Women's Conference closed on July 27th with the Installation of New Officers. The officers are President, Sis. Raquel Contreras, Chile; Executive Director, Sis. Patsy Davis and Secretary/Treasurer, Sis. Donna Groover.

We were then free to explore Hawaii and partake of the splendor of God's creation. Sight-seeing, luaus, dinner cruises, shopping, wading in the ocean and much more was on the agenda for rest of the day and the next day.

The Baptist World Conference, July 28th thru August 1st, was held at the Hawaii Convention Center. Their theme was "Hear The Spirit" (Luke 4:18). Unlike the Women's Conference, this conference accomodated adults, youth and children. It too was prayerfully organized and taught the same message but age appropriately.

Upon entering the Hawaii Convention center we were greeted with a concert by a two hundred (200) voice children choir from South Korea. What a joy to hear them singing praises to God in various languages. Also, it was uplifting to see entire families participating in the conference.

This conference was comprised of four thousand (4,000) people representing one hundred twenty (120) countries. The Baptist World Alliance (BWA) consists as of October, 2009, 160,000 churches with a combined membership of 37,105,001 members. ALL PRAISES BE UNTO OUR GOD!

Our morning sessions began with devotion and congregation singing, A Bible Lesson based on the theme was then given (We were given Bible Studies Booklets so we could study prior to the lecture). We then dismissed to Discussion Groups which were led by dynamic, committed men and women of God. The Groups were in a variety of languages.

On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, from 1:00PM to 4:00PM was **Mission In Action** time. The various

mission projects included: Stop Hunger Now, Hygiene Kits, Sleeping Bags, Meal Preparation, Clothes Sorting, Painting, Graffiti Painting and Prayer Stations. We chose Stop Hunger Now project. We, as volunteers, packaged a healthy meal (consisting of rice, dried vegetables, vitamins and soy powder) into a bag - each bag holds four meals. The bags were then sealed, packaged, and shipped and distributed through schools where hunger is an issue. We packaged six thousand (6,000) meals during our shift. The volunteers included children and youth.

The evening sessions were sermons, skits, musicals, etc. They always reflected the diversity of the group. Each event was done in more than one language and we were taught to appreciate and embrace our differences.

It was not by chance that the closing session was a Sunday Morning Worship Experience. Rev. Lance Watson, Senior Pastor, St. Paul Baptist Church, Richmond, Virginia, USA. He spoke from Acts 10:37-39, Hear The Spirit: Dedication.

We arrived in Tampa, via Houston, August 2, 2010, a little jet-lagged but so much richer for having been given the opportunity to see the power of our God at work. He allowed us to witness so much, but what will we do with the information given? To whom much is given, much is required....Will we **Hear The Spirit and then** Walk In The Spirit? The choice is ours!
