"The Lord did not curse the barren tree because it failed to provide food for His hunger, but because it had leaves and no fruit. Fig trees in that area yield fruit in both June and August and it is normal for the figs to hang on the trees through the winter. New fruit grows right over the old and out of the old shoots. Consequently, fruit can normally be found on the trees all year round."

I'm not going to get into how we can look like a Christian and not possess the fruit of Christianity, but I want to focus on the Message Jesus gave to his disciples as a result of the experience with the un-barren fig tree.


