reetings to each of you in the Mighty Name of Jesus Christ!

For we recognize that , "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints."

As I began to ponder the many circumstances that exist in these perilous times, I was reminded of the Christian's role, more specifically, Christian women's role as we face issues from day to day. It is evident that we have much to do and it can only come about through our commitment, dedication and saying yes to God's will. What happens when Christian women say YES to God's will?

The role of each of us must be to serve our Lord and Savior in accordance with what we know as the WILL of God. As women, we have been endowed with unique qualities ,that when used properly, permits us fellowship with God. We are blessed with:

- **Intellect** which allows us to acquire knowledge, that is, **To Know Him!**

The first goal that disciples of the Lord Jesus must achieve is a **Surrendered Life** to the Will and Way of Christ. In order to know the Will of God for your life, there are three things needed, according to Romans 12:1-2:

- **Presentation:** "Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God which is your reasonable service."
- **Transformation:** "And be not conformed to this world: but be transformed by the renewing of your mind,"
- **Divine Information:** "That ye may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect Will of God."

A second goal that must be achieved, as written in Psalm 40:8, is to delight in doing the Will of God. David uses "delight" in his declaration about God's Word and God's Will. In fact, this "delight" took precedence over all other pleasures in his life. He recognized that fulfillment comes when we obey God and do His will. Every child of God should receive gratification in obeying God. What declarations have you made to God about your "delights"?

The next goal that should be achieved is the knowledge of the WORD of GOD. The WORD gives us, not only the knowledge of His Will, but also the desire to do it. There is power in the Word of God which brings the human mind in conformity with His Purpose and Will for our lives. Receiving the WORD makes a difference in the life of the believer. By receiving it, when one believes it, he becomes a doer of it.

When we say "Yes" to God, we have, as described in John 8:31-32 verses:

- Freedom to conform to the image of God
- Freedom to become all that God will have us to be
- Freedom to obey His voice when He speaks
- Freedom to let go of worldly pleasures and pursue our delights in the Lord.

When we say "Yes " to His Will, the world will know that we are God's people doing God's will.

It is written in 1John 5:2-3, "By this we know that we love the children of God when we love God and keep His commandments. For this is the love of God that, we keep His commandments: and His commandments are not grievance." "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world."

I am so glad that I am the Lord's servant and can be a witness to His purpose and presence on earth which has power to transform the life of anyone who accepts Him as Lord and Savior. What about you? Just as David, are you willing to shout aloud your delight in doing His Will? Do you love Him? Do you seek to obey Him?

Lastly, be reminded that Christian women established in the Word of God ,serving God and doing His will knows that it is never about us, but , it's all about HIM!


God wants us to celebrate the good things he has done for us! Then on a regular basis we need to add to the list and Thank, Honor, and Praise God for the things he has done on our behalf.
