

reetings and Salutations to you in the Name Of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As we gather for the 99th session of the Progressive Missionary and Educational Baptist State Convention of Florida, Incorporated, I reflected on the fact that we have so very much for which to be thankful. God has truly blessed us through the years. Our founding fathers and mothers had a grand vision in their quest towards unity, love, fellowship and support of one another as they broadened our outreach in kingdom building. Each generation has made a positive impact in the growth, spirituality and longevity of this convention. Can you believe it? As God wills, we're about to reach our Centennial Celebration. We can joyfully thank God for His divine favor!

In reflecting on our convention, past, present and the years to come, I perceive that one of our greatest needs is to evaluate our positioning on our "passion for purpose". Evidence abounds that we have majored in "being" while minoring in "purpose". Whatever reward the Lord has for us will not be given for our having been present. The reward is only for the service rendered to the kingdom of God.

Genesis 12:2b describes God's purpose for His gracious call. It says, I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." This verse speaks unequivocally of God's

purpose; that the chosen, "will be a blessing." It is evident in these words that much of the reason for the present day church's dilemma is that of not being a viable and effective tool in the hands of the Master to reconcile this world unto Himself. Is there evidence, for the most part, that we care about presence rather than purpose? Let's think about it.......

- Are we guilty of seeking to bless ourselves, which directly contradicts, "I will bless you"?
- Are we attempting, in contradiction to the Word, to make our names great? The Word says, "I will make your name great!
- Is it our aim and purpose to be a blessing to others?

We must not allow ourselves to look for glory when the Lord allows our mission efforts to meet with success. We must give God the glory for the things He hath done, because the glory belongs to Him.

We are called of God to break the ties of former things and "go out". God's first promise is..."I will bless thee". God has promised us this blessing as we work to please Him. We need to be reminded of our purpose, and we know our goals. There is much to do, if we want to be blessed:

• Evangelistically, we are to reach the lost with a direct focus on saving souls by

sharing the Good News found in the Word of God, locally, state and worldwide. We must go and tell men who He is and what He can do. We must tell them that He is willing and able to save their souls.

• Educationally, we must promote Biblical literacy through workshops, seminars and trainings in the preparation of the edification of the Kingdom of God.

Our youth need assistance in developing, not only a strong Christian Education, but a sound secular education that will provide them the tools necessary to live as productive Christians in our ever - changing world.

- We must reach out and serve others as needs exist, wherever they exist.
- We must exalt God as we enhance and intensify our adoration and praise.

The second of God's promise in this scripture is that, "I will make your Name great! The desire for a great name has been the ruin of many. He alone gives our name renown. The names of the Apostles and others of the New Testament were made great because they lived true to their calling and within the purpose sanctioned and sustained by the Lord, Jesus Christ.

Lastly, there is a promise that, "thou shalt be a blessing." The measure of our faith determines the blessings we shall transmit to others. The blessed are to become a blessing.

The Church is expected to be a treasure house of grace. The narrow and selfish concern for our own interests must be swallowed up in the highest vision of that purpose for which we are called-that of being the suffering servant of the human

condition. God has blessed us by the gift of His Son, Jesus.

To that end, we who are joined to the mystical body of Christ, are Abraham's seed, and because of that, He promised, "Thou shalt be blessing!" The sense of a positive appointment, of a destiny to live up to a purpose, is the most powerful motive of which the human mind is capable.

Whoever desires to be a blessing must be a people of faith, prayer, and love. A dark and dying world awaits our living up to our purpose.

Let us be reminded that the reward the Lord holds for us is for service to the Kingdom of God.
